Curriculum on a Page for Parents EYFS

Autumn 1 Term



Writing

We will begin with learning about mark making and putting meaning to our marks.

The children will be encouraged to learn to recognise and write their name.

We will model writing letters and simple words with the children, using print as the formation.



History

As historians, this term we will be learning about our own history. Looking at our family tree, the queen's family tree and how houses and toys have changed over time. We will be linking our learning to the question: Where do we belong?



Art

As artists, will be learning different skills to help them create a portrait of themselves.



Understanding the World

The children will be learning about the season Autumn.

They will also be exploring the natural world around them by looking at the animals, plants and trees they can find and identifying these. We will also be linking our learning to our story; Monkey puzzle, looking at how the butterfly changes, the types of birds and how the change in temperature affects animals.



Reading



We will be reading Monkey Puzzled by Julia Donaldson, as this links to our topic Marvellous Me.

The children will be having daily phonics lessons using the programme Little Wandle.

The children will start to learn the sounds that each letter makes and then to blend these sounds together to make words.

The children will also participate in reading sessions throughout the week.



This term we will be understanding our own feelings and those of others and begin to regulate their behaviour accordingly.



Music

As musicians, we will be learning songs for our daily routines and songs linked to our learning. The children will also be exploring sound.



Maths

We will focus on children's ability to recognise, represent and manipulate numbers to 5. Children begin by counting groups of objects up to 3, then 4, before looking at 5. Children will learn to recognise and count different representations of numbers up to 5 and use a five frame to help structure the counting and reasoning.

PSHE

This term we are concentrating on the children understanding the new routines. We are developing the children's confidence as they come in to school and join in with wider school activities. We are also helping children build relationships and friesndships.



This term child will be learning about Being special: where do we belong? This investigation enables pupils to think about how each person is unique and valuable and consider religious beliefs about this. It allows pupils the opportunity to think about groups to which they belong, how some people belong to religious groups and what this means. Pupils will look at occasions marking belonging from a number of faiths, including welcoming ceremonies from Christianity and Islam and Raksha Bandhan in Hinduism.
