1. Introduction

At Coton School, we believe that bullying is:

- Pushing and kicking
- Saying not nice words
- Talking about someone behind their back
- If you are online and you are playing a game and someone sends you an unkind message
 Then tell an adult in school or a parent at home or even an older sibling

Bullying is NOT:

- Falling out with a friend
- Accidently bumping into someone
- Ore accidentally throwing a temper a someone only because they made you annoyed

2. Aims

- Tell an adult if you feel bullying is taking place
- To stop bullying forever
- Press the STOP button to send an email to Mr Smith
- Complete a pupil voice sheet

3. Prevention

- Mr Smith or your teacher will talk to the bully
- The whole school has PSHE lessons
- We have Odd Socks Day
- Everybody writes their name on an Anti-Bullying charter at the start of the year
- We have a STOP button on the school website you can ask your parents to show you how
- If you tell a teacher that you feel you are being bullied they will listen to you
- We also have the School Parliament



4. Reporting

- Tell Mrs Knowles, Mrs Mailer or your parents
- Press the STOP button to send an email to Mr Smith
- Move your name on the feelings chart to get a teacher to talk to you
- Take part in Odd Sock Day and Anti-Bullying Week

5. How we are an anti-bullying school

We have the STOP button



- If you tell a teacher or any adult in school, they will record it and help you
- If someone is lonely you could ask to play with them
- If someone is hurt, you could help them
- Tell Mr Smith and he will talk to the bully
- You could put your name down on the feelings chart in the classroom
