# 4. How to report bullying



This is the stop button

In Coton in the Elms Primary School to report bullying, you can:

- press the stop button on the website
- tell an adult or teacher
- fill in a pupil voice sheet
- ask your friend to tell a teacher

The pupil voice sheet is a piece of paper you write on to tell an adult what has happened or if you are worried about being bullied in school. The S.T.O.P button is found on the school website and it stands for several times on purpose. If you are being bullied outside of school, tell an adult about what happened. If you are being bullied

in school, tell a teacher or member of staff. Tell a friend if you are being bullied, they might be able to help you if you are bit nervous after what has happened.

## 5. How we are an anti-bullying school

We have not got many bullies in our school. We have anti-bullying week every year. We have an anti-bullying charter that the students sign every year to promise that we will not be unkind to others.
